YEAR 1 AND 2 RACV INCURSION



On Tuesday 23 June, we went to the R.A.C.V. road safety Incursion. We learnt that pedestrians need to look out for all vehicles, street signs and we need to Stop, Look, Listen and Think when we cross the road. Anne Hughes was the presenter. She taught us lots of fun rhymes, songs and raps to help us remember safety rules. We learnt many road safety rules.

When you are riding your bike at night time, wear light coloured clothes so drivers can see you.



When wearing a bike helmet make sure it is covering the whole of your brain!

Make eye contact with drivers at zebra crossings so you know they are stopping and it is safe to cross the road.

Your seatbelt needs to sit on your collar bone, sternum and hip bone.

Hold an adults hand when you cross the road.

If you are riding your bike on a path, stay on the left hand side.

Always hop off your bike when crossing a road.

When we are passengers in a car we need to get out on the footpath side and not on the road side.

Children must be 145cm tall or taller in order to sit without a booster seat and it is safer for them to sit in the back seat.




