School Activities

School Council met on Monday 23rd October with another full agenda for discussion. We farewell Maria Duggan from School Council and thank Maria for all of her hard work and her thoughtful contributions to council discussions. We welcome Elena Lee (Jayden 3J and Ezra 1T) to school council.

Peer Review

The Peer Review process continued into this term, with the second day of the peer review running on October 12th. On this day we undertook lots of interviews with parents, staff and students as a way of understanding what all of these important people thought about Donburn Primary School. We received lots of positive and useful suggestions which will be used to formulate the strategic direction and plan for Donburn for the next 4 years. We are currently awaiting the consolidated draft results of the peer review and this will then be taken to school council for approval. Once approved, we will disseminate a summary of the results.

Fundraising Activities

The wonderful P&F team have been extremely busy over the past few months. There has been an ENORMOUS amount of activity going on for the children to enjoy – the Colour Run, the Spring Fair (and in the background the follow-up of the chocolate drive and planning for Father's Day and Christmas stalls!!). This group of people do an AMAZING job with the sole purpose of providing activities the children can enjoy whilst raising funds for the school.



To date, the P& F have raised over \$21,000, which has enabled the school to invest in 80 new iPads (which will be used in all classrooms across the school).

The Earn and Learn program (through Woolworths) has seen the school invest in maths equipment.

Thank you to all of the families, friends and extended families who participate in these fund-raising activities, the funds raised go directly back to improving your child's education.

Do you want to know how rich people lived in the olden days?

The Year 3 students from Donburn, went to Como House on the Wednesday 1 November.

Como House is in Williams Street, South Yarra. The Donburn students went for a walk around Como House with two guides named Janine and Bronwyn. They reported that there was a big safe under the stairs.

The Donburn students said they had an amazing time learning about the history of Como House and they hope to go there again soon.



'Storytellers Club' began on Thursday 26 October 2017. Children were all welcome to bring a **picture book** from their home to read to an avid audience in the Library.


We were lucky enough to hear **7 storytellers** read their favourite picture books during lunchtime. The Storytellers Club will run every Thursday until the end of Term.


