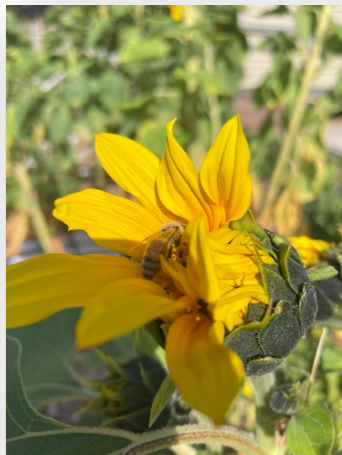
SUSTAINABILITY AT DONBURN

Acceptable Use Agreement

When I use digital technologies and the internet I agree to be a safe, responsible and ethical user at all times by:

1. **Communicating respectfully**, thinking and checking that what I write or post online is polite and respectful.

I will do this by:

- o Only sending kind and respectful messages to others online and reporting mean or bullying messages to a trusted adult.
- o Ensuring I am kind and inclusive to others on the phone or over the internet.
- o Making sure I am presenting and using my own work, and including references when I gain information from someone else's ideas.
- o Getting permission before sharing photos/videos/voice recordings of another person.
- o Displaying courtesy, consideration and respect for others when using a mobile phone.
- o Only using my mobile phone inside of the school property with a teacher present or before 7:30am and after 6pm.
- o Turning my mobile phone or smartwatch off and placing it in the lockable box in my classroom. I can make calls from the school office if I need to.

2. **Protecting personal information** and being aware that my full name, photo, birthday, address and phone number are personal information and are not to be shared online.

I will do this by:

- o Protecting my friend's information in the same way.
- o Protecting my password and not sharing it with others.
- o Only joining a space online with my parent or teacher's guidance and permission.
- o Never answering questions online that ask for my personal information.

3. **Looking after myself and others**, thinking about what I share online or with a mobile phone.

I will do this by:

- o Never sharing my friend's full names, birthdays, school names, addresses and phone numbers because this is their personal information.
- o Speaking to a trusted adult if I see something that makes me feel upset or if I need help.
- o Speaking to a trusted adult if someone is unkind to me.
- o Speaking to a trusted adult if I know someone is upset or scared.
- o Thinking about what I am posting before I share it online.
- o Using spaces or sites that are appropriate for my age.
- o Using the internet for appropriate and safe research.

- o Turning off the device/blackout the screen if I see something I don't like and telling a trusted adult.
- o Reporting any content, messages, videos, photos or phone calls that are unpleasant or make me feel uncomfortable to a trusted adult.
- o Only engaging, communicating and following people online I know and trust.
- o Being careful with the equipment I use.
- o Safely supporting my friends/peers when they are experiencing difficult online situations.

In addition, when I use my personal mobile phone I agree to be a safe, responsible and ethical user at all times by following the eSmart student user agreement. I understand that if I break these rules I may not be allowed to bring my phone to school. I understand that bringing a mobile phone to school is my responsibility and at my own risk. I understand that the use of all smartwatches that incorporate messaging and phone calls are not allowed during school hours.

This Acceptable Use Agreement also applies during school excursions, camps, and extracurricular activities. I acknowledge and agree to follow these rules. I understand that my access to the internet at school will be renegotiated if I do not act responsibly. I understand and agree to comply with the terms of acceptable use and expected standards of behaviour set out within this agreement.

I understand that there are actions and consequences established within the school and that any breach of these conditions will result in internet and mobile technology access privileges being suspended or revoked.

I authorise the Victorian Department of Education (DE) to use Centrelink Confirmation eServices to perform an enquiry about my Centrelink customer details and concession card status to enable the business to determine if I qualify for a concession, rebate or service. I also authorise the Victorian Department of Families, Fairness and Housing (DFFH) to provide the results of any enquiry to DE regarding temporary care orders.

I understand that:

- DFFH or Centrelink will use information I have provided to DE to confirm my eligibility for the Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund and will disclose to DE personal information including my name, address, payment and concession card type and status.
- This consent, once signed, remains valid while my child is enrolled at a registered Victorian school unless I withdraw it by contacting the school.
- I can obtain proof of my circumstances/details from DFFH and provide it to my child's school so that my eligibility for the Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund can be determined.
- If I withdraw my consent or do not alternatively provide proof of my circumstances/details, I may not be eligible for the Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund provided by DE.
- Information regarding my eligibility for the Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund may be disclosed to DFFH and/or State Schools Relief for the purpose of evaluating concession card services or confirming eligibility for assistance.

You can request access to the personal information that we hold about you, and to request that any errors be corrected, by contacting your child's school.

Camps, Sports and Excursions fund eligibility

Below are the criteria used to determine a student's eligibility for the Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF).

Criteria 1 – Eligibility

To be eligible* for the fund, a mature minor of sixteen years of age or over, a parent or legal guardian of a student attending a registered Government or non-government Victorian primary or secondary school must:

- on the first day of Term one, or;
 - on the first day of Term two.
- a) Be an eligible beneficiary within the meaning of the State Concessions Act 2004, that is, be a holder of Veterans Affairs Gold Card or be an eligible Centrelink Health Care Card (HCC) or Pensioner Concession Card (PCC) holder, OR
 - b) Be a temporary foster parent, and;
 - c) Submit an application to the school by the due date.

* A special consideration eligibility category also exists. For more information, see: [Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund \(CSEF\): Eligibility | education.vic.gov.au](https://www.education.vic.gov.au/csef/eligibility)

Mature minors or parents who receive a Carer Allowance on behalf of a child, or any other benefit or allowance not income tested by Centrelink, are not eligible for the CSEF unless they also comply with one of (a) or (b) above.

Criteria 2 - Be of school age and attend school in Victoria

School is compulsory for all Victorian children aged between six and seventeen years of age inclusive.

For the purposes of CSEF, students may be eligible for assistance if they attend a Victorian registered primary or secondary school. Typically, these students are aged between five and eighteen years inclusive.

CSEF is not payable to students attending pre-school, kindergarten, home schooling, or TAFE.

Eligibility Date

For concession card holders, CSEF eligibility will be subject to the parent/legal guardian's concession card being successfully validated with Centrelink on **29 January 2024 and/or 15 April 2024**.

Payment amounts

CSEF payment amount

The CSEF is an annual payment to the school to be used towards camps, sports and/or excursion expenses for the benefit of the eligible student.

- Primary school student rate: \$150.00 per year.
- Secondary school student rate: \$250.00 per year.

The CSEF is paid directly the school and will be allocated by the school towards camps, sports and/or excursion costs for your child.

For ungraded students, the rate payable is determined by the student's date of birth. For more information, see: [Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund \(CSEF\): Payment amounts | education.vic.gov.au](https://www.education.vic.gov.au/csef/payment-amounts)

Foundation and Year 7 government school students who are CSEF recipients are also eligible for a uniform voucher. Schools are required to make applications on behalf of parents, so please register your interest at the school.

How to complete the application form

NOTE: ALL SECTIONS MUST BE COMPLETED BY PARENT/LEGAL GUARDIAN

1. Complete the PARENT/LEGAL GUARDIAN DETAILS section.
Make sure that the Surname, First Name, and Customer Reference Number (CRN) details match those on your concession card. You will also need to provide your concession card to the school.
If you are claiming as a Foster Parent or a Veteran Affairs Pensioner, you will need to provide a copy of documentation confirming your status as a temporary Foster Parent or provide your Veterans Affairs Pensioner Gold card to the school.
2. Complete the STUDENT/S DETAILS section for students at this school.
3. Sign and date the form and return it to the school office as soon as possible. The CSEF program for 2024 closes at the end of term two 2024.

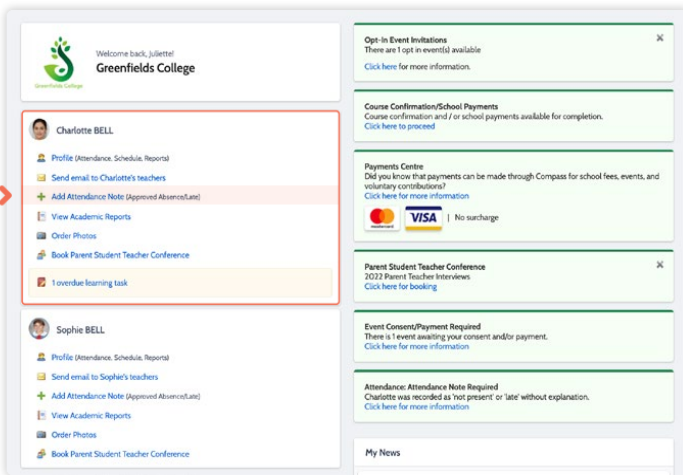
CSEF payments cannot be claimed retrospectively for prior years.

COMPASS - HOW TO ADD ATTENDANCE NOTES



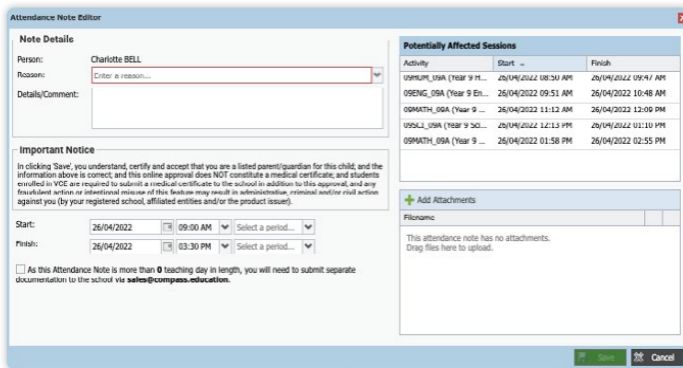
How To: Add an Attendance Note for an upcoming Absence



If your child is going to be away, you can add in an Attendance note to advise the school.

To do so, click '[Add Attendance Note \(Approved Absence/Late\)](#)'.

If using a browser, follow these instructions.



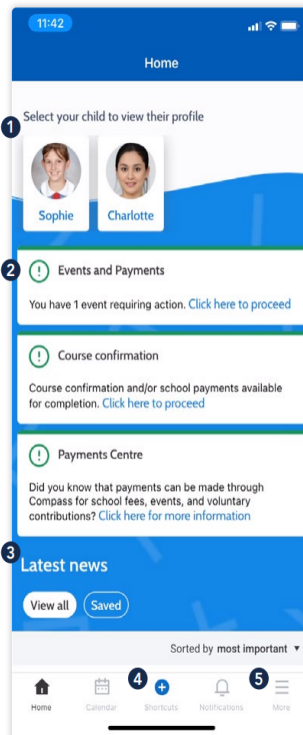
A Note screen will open.

Select the applicable reason from the drop down list; add in any additional information if applicable in the Details/Comment box.

Select the start and finish date/time of the absence and click '[Save](#)'.

The App Home Page

If using the App, tap on the Shortcuts button (the + sign at the bottom of the screen) to add an attendance note.



When logged in, you will see:

1 Profiles

Each of your children who attend the school will appear at the top of the screen. Click their image to go to their profiles.

Within the profile you can access information pertaining to your child such as their schedule, learning tasks, attendance approvals and reports.

2 Alerts

Notifications of items that require your action.

3 Newsfeed

Scroll through to view the latest posts from your school.

4 Shortcuts

The shortcuts button allows you to perform quick actions such as adding an attendance note or paying for an event.

5 More

Gives you access to additional actions – see next page.



How To: Add an Attendance Note for an Unexplained Absence

If your child has been marked Not Present without an explanation, you will be required to add an **Attendance Note**.

You will see an alert on your homescreen.

Click the alert and it will take you to your child's **'Unexplained'** attendance tab where you will see any sessions listed for which they were marked as Not Present or Late.

Select the session (or sessions) that you are adding a note for and then click **'Explain with Attendance Note'**.

This will cause the Attendance Note screen to pop open.

Select the applicable reason for the absence and add in the relevant details/comment.

Click **'Save'**. This will assign the attendance note to the sessions you selected and they will update to no longer show as unexplained absences.
