

SCHOOL WIDE POSITIVE BEHAVIOUR SUPPORT (SWPBS)

Hello Donburn students and families,

These past two weeks each year level has had an opportunity to choose what their classroom SWPBS focus is and we wanted to share what some of our cohorts have chosen.

Foundation

In Foundation our focus has been *playing safely* in the school yard. All three classes did a whole school walk and modelled safe ways to use our play equipment and outdoor areas.

Year One

In Year One we have been focusing on *speaking nicely* to each other. In class we have been looking at the difference between 'bucket fillers' and 'bucket dippers', then creating our own bucket fillers.

Year Two

Our team chose *speaking nicely* under the respectful umbrella, to ensure that our students are practising speaking kindly to each other in both the classroom and out in the yard.

Year Three

The Year 3 focus was *following instructions*. The students are currently attending their swimming program and we wanted to ensure they followed the simple instructions given by both Donburn staff and swimming instructors.

Year Four

The Year 4 team have chosen *positive learning* as our focus. We chose it because a lot of our students were avoiding work they found too challenging and were saying things like, 'I can't do it' or 'My work isn't good'. To support our students in becoming more positive about their work we are going to create class goals/expectations about what it means to be a positive learner and model what it looks like.

Year Five

Our SWPBS focus for Year 5 was *using our time efficiently*. We know that this is an important skill as it helps us to be positive learners and prepares us for high school. We used timers and other tools to make sure we were organised and we scored lots of positive learner hoots for our hard work!

Year Six

The focus in Year 6 has been *organisation*. As we are preparing the students for high school, it is important that they are prepared for each session with their materials and books, and are finishing their learning tasks in a timely manner.
