Donburn will be involved in a school review in Term 3.

The first stage of the review is a Self-Evaluation process that we will work through next term.

The school self-evaluation involves the school community identifying its progress, achievements and areas for future improvement. It provides schools with a process to collect data from diverse sources to inform action for improving student outcomes and professional learning, much the same as we use student data to identify a student's zone of proximal development.

School reflection and self-evaluation helps identify:

- what is working well
- what needs to continue
- which areas of the school's work may need to be improved or further developed.

It informs decisions relating to priority-setting, initiatives, strategies and actions for improvement.

As part of the improvement cycle, each Victorian government school undertakes a review every four years. The school community completes a comprehensive self-evaluation against the FISO continua of practice, which should involve students, teachers and community members.

An independent analysis is also completed of a school's performance against our goals and targets in the school strategic plan. The review evaluates the school's strengths, areas for improvement and the impact of its improvement efforts.

At the end of the review, a new four-year school strategic plan is created and endorsed by the school community.

As part of the review process we will have a *pupil free day on Friday 30 April* for staff to work on the Self-Evaluation.

I wish everyone a happy and safe holiday and look forward to returning for a productive Term 2.

COMPASS COVID NOTICE

Dear Parents and Carers

The Victorian Government has further relaxed its COVIDSafe settings from 6pm on Friday 26 March 2021.

Changes to the COVIDSafe settings include allowing more visitors in the home, changes to mask wearing in some settings and updates to density limits in some settings. There are limited operational changes for schools.

Visitors continue to be welcomed at our school, however face masks must be carried by individuals 12 years and over at all times and worn when physical distancing of 1.5 metres cannot be maintained.

"I liked the Gymbus because inside I was playing like a monkey! I went to the top of the Gymbus and came down a pole by myself." Iris FE


"When I was in the Gymbus, I did the monkey bars and I felt proud because I have practiced a lot and made it across!" Austin FE











SPACE DOME INCURSION - YEAR 6

On 4th of March 2021, the Year 6s attended a Space Dome incursion in the hall. The setup was a giant inflatable cinematic dome. We went in and sat inside the dome. The director, Nick, illuminated it using a projector, which made it look like a miniature planetarium. He then gave us an overview of the entire solar system and the planets.

We explored the planets in even greater detail. We also discussed how the young earth collided with a mars sized celestial object called Theia. The collision transformed the minerals into iron and the remaining chunks became our satellite, the Moon. We also learnt how the Sun orbits a supermassive black hole called Sagittarius A at the centre of the Milky Way galaxy. It was a remarkable experience seeing the planets on a projected image. We learned more about the solar system through this incursion.

Dear Students, Parents and Carers

You are invited to participate in the Science Talent Search for 2021! The theme for this year is 'Food: Different by Design.'

The website for the Science Talent Search is:

http://www.sciencevictoria.com.au/sts/

It is recommended that you download the STS handbook and refer to it to check important details.

The Science Talent Search is run by the Science Teachers' Association of Victoria. It is open to students from Foundation to Year 6 and involves students completing a project in their own time at home. There are a number of different categories in the competition and students should choose one of the following sections to focus on: Creative Writing; Posters/Scientific Wallcharts; Working Models; Inventions; Experimental Research; Videos; Games; Computer Programs or Science Photography. There are set topics for Creative Writing and Posters/Scientific Wallcharts sections only and further details can be found on the website. In past years, Donburn has had a number of winners of bursary awards and all students found it a very positive experience.

Important information:

A meeting was held for interested students at lunch time and registration forms were handed out. Forms can also be downloaded from the Science Talent Search's website (see above for web details.) Additional meetings will be held in Term 2 and students will be notified when they will take place by their classroom teacher.

All registrations (on the form) must be submitted to me or to the Office by Friday 21 May. Once your registration form has been received, a payment will be raised on Compass in your child's name for the cost of the Science Talent Search. All payments must be made by Wednesday 26 May at the latest in order for us to have time to register students on the STS portal. The STS does not accept any late entries. Please note that entries do not have to be complete until July/August.

SCIENCE TALENT SEARCH - FOOD: DIFFERENT BY DESIGN...cont

There is a fee for entering the competition: Individual \$8 per entry. If students are working in a group (maximum of two students), the fee is \$15, and this cost will be split between the two students on Compass (so they will pay \$7.50 each.)

Donburn is only permitted to enter a certain number of entries based on our size. It is recommended that entry forms and money be submitted early please to be sure of a place. Entries will be submitted according to the date they were received.

In our experience, students that do well in the competition very closely follow the entry guidelines and we recommend reading these very carefully and adhering to all recommendations.

Experimental Research and Creative Writing categories: entries are due in on **Monday 12 July** (to us at school) and must be submitted electronically (for example on a USB.)


Models, Inventions, Computer Programs, Games, Photography, Posters and Video categories: Entries are taken to a Judging Day which students must attend and will be held on **Saturday 7 August** (morning). This takes place at a number of locations: MLC in Kew, Wesley College in Prahran, Auburn

South Primary School in Hawthorn or Parade College in Bundoora. Further information will follow closer to the date and more detailed information is given in the STS Handbook online.
