We had to swim, take a deep breath and duck down underwater to grab the sinking toy. The activities were great and we had the best day.

Don't go in the water without someone watching

Don't push people around the water

Don't run around wet areas

Be careful not to splash people

Listen to your swimming teacher

Don't jump into the pool if you don't know how deep it is

To enter the pool safely put your hands on the edge and then turn into the pool

If you are in trouble in the water raise your hand and wave to get the attention of someone.

We had a great time at swimming, but after we were very tired and hungry!

Swimming in 1V

1V have enjoyed learning to swim and learning about water safety during our swimming lessons at Aquarena.

We all learnt many new skills in the water including the stingray, the dolphin,

using the noodle, treading water, freestyle, backstroke, the torpedo, using life jackets and collecting sinking toys under water.

We had lots of fun in the water because we learnt new skills and swam with our friends.







YEARS 1 AND 2 SWIMMING SAFETY PROGRAM

Swimming in 2P

For the last two weeks, Years 1 and 2 have been going to swimming. We travelled to swimming on the bus. We got on one by one with Mr Terry-Whyte "boop" counting us on. It was so exciting, it sounded like a birthday party, (a little bit noisy).

One the favourite activities we did was wearing lifejackets. Knowing how to wear a lifejacket properly can save people's lives. We also did a pin drop into the deep end so we knew how to get into the pool safely. Freestyle is a stroke that we need to increase our speed in the water. We also learnt torpedo where your legs have to kick a lot. Other things we learnt were backstroke, survival backstroke and breaststroke, cannon ball and treading water. Sinky toys sink to the bottom of the swimming pool. You have to dive in and grab the toy. Sometimes it could be very challenging getting the toy. Wearing goggles helped you to see in the water.

At the end of the lesson we went to the change rooms to get dressed. It was a bit crowded. The worst part was getting our socks on. Swimming was lots of fun.










GARDENING CLUB - TUESDAYS




