Recycling and Sustainability:


We all got to visit Linda for some activities and information about Recycling and how important it is. Recycling is reusing an object or material.

Paper can be recycled and you can also use both sides of the paper. When you put plastic bags in the recycling bin do not put them flat or they could be mistaken as paper and jam the system. Linda gave us some recycling activity books and a recycled pencil!










YEAR 1 COOKING SAVOURY AND SWEET CARROT MUFFINS


On Friday, I participated in a school diving competition. Everyone had to complete 3 different dives. We had a practice session when we arrived, then we watched some advanced divers while
