
Assemblies

On the last day people said goodbye to their friends and some even asked for their contact details. Finally we got on the bus, desperate to see our loving families again.





TRAFFIC SAFETY AT DONBURN

At Donburn we value the safety of our students. We now have 480 students from 374 families and vehicle traffic near our school has increased at drop-off and pick-up times. Parents and carers, please ensure you park your car with care and consideration of students, their families and our neighbours.

Please **DO NOT** park across driveways or in the teacher carparks in Pine Way or Colchester Drive.

Take note of the **parking restrictions** in the local streets to avoid fines. You may have to park further along the street and <u>walk</u> up to the school to drop-off or pick-up students. Please <u>use the paths</u>

instead of walking across the carparks with your children, for safety.





No Parking signs

If there is a 'No Parking' sign, you can stop for 2 minutes in that area:

- if you are picking up or dropping off passengers or goods
- if you stay within 3 metres of your vehicle.

If you stop in, or partly in, an area showing a No Parking sign and you are not picking up or dropping off passengers or goods, you are considered to be parked and can be fined. This is the case even if you stay with your vehicle.

This applies at the 'Kiss and Go' areas on Colchester Drive and Aintree Avenue.



No Stopping signs

If there is a 'no stopping' sign, you are **not allowed** to stop or park your car in, or partly in, that area for any reason.

Dropping off or picking up passengers or goods in a 'no stopping' area is **not** permitted.



Permit zone

Only vehicles displaying a valid permit (issued by the relevant authority) can park or stop in a permit zone.

Azalea Avenue is a Permit Zone. Do not park in this street.

Kiss & Go zone

Understanding the rules

Kiss & Go zones are for your child's safety, your convenience and to minimise congestion and confusion.





Kiss & Go rules

- Kiss & Go zones and 'No Parking' zones operate under the same conditions.
- You may stop to drop off or pick up children for a maximum of 2 minutes.
- Driver must remain in or within 3 meters of the vehicle.
- Zone applies only during the hours of operation stated on the No Parking Sign.

Remember...

· Do not leave your vehicle

To assist with traffic flow, drivers should remain in the car whilst children get in and out.

Be timely

If your child does not get in or out of the vehicle within 2 minutes you must leave and re-enter the Kiss & Go zone.

Stay in sequence

Drop off or pick up your child close to the top of the zone, allowing vehicles following you to enter the zone in an orderly manner.

Child safety

Please ensure children get in or out of the vehicle on the kerb side. The back seat is the safest seat for children to travel in, regardless of the make of the vehicle. Ensure children have their restraints securely fastened before driving off.

No U-turns


Do not do U-turn in busy school zones. They are dangerous and put children at risk.




